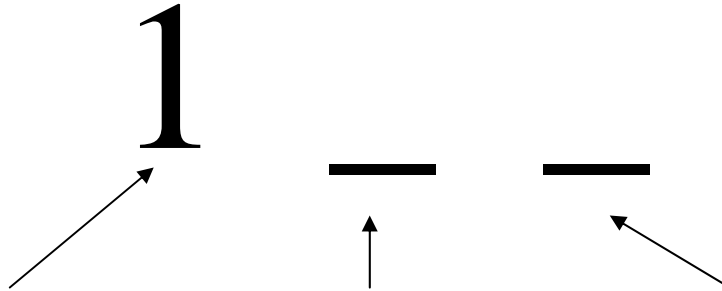


Foreign Language Course Numbering System for 100-Level Courses

Overview:

- L1 courses are numbered in the 110s
- L2 courses are numbered in the 120s
- L3 courses are numbered in the 130s
- L4 courses are numbered in the 140s
- L5 courses may be numbered 150 and higher



All L1-L4 courses are in the 100's, as are many L5 courses. This document describes only how 100-level courses are numbered.

Assignment of courses numbers 200 and above is entirely at department's discretion, and these courses may or may not be designated L5.

The middle number is the "L" level the course fulfills for the foreign language requirement.

0 = Course does not count toward language requirement (e.g. introductory courses in English, reading courses in English)

1 = L1

2 = L2

3 = L3

4 = L4

5 = L5 (5th semester level)

6 & 7 = L5 (above 5th semester)

8 & 9 = Advanced 100-level courses; may or may not be L5

Third digit for courses 110 – 155:

0 = regular sequence

1 = alternate track (see below)

2 = sequence for heritage learners, bilingual speakers (e.g. Spanish), advanced learners (EALL)

3 = courses taught only in summer (e.g. the regular 110 taught in summer would be S110; but a distinct L1 course offered just for summer students could be S113)

4 = intensive, completing 3 semesters of study in 2 semesters (no such courses exist yet)

5 = intensive, completing 2 semesters of study in 1 semester

6 = cross-training sequence for speakers of another specific language (e.g. Portuguese for Spanish-speakers)

1, 7, 8, 9 = reserved for other track possibilities (e.g. additional dialects and variants, false beginners, additional cross-training tracks, varying paces, etc.)

1 = alternate 150-level option in some languages (in many, 150 and 151 can be taken in either order)

7 = used in NELC for Biblical Hebrew and Coptic

Common Examples:

Standard course sequence for first two years: 110, 120, 130, 140

Heritage course sequence (non-intensive): 112, 122, 132, 142

Intensive (four semesters in two): 125, 145

Details:

1. Courses will use unique Course IDs for each semester. No course number (e.g. 115) will be reused for multiple semesters at different levels.
2. Course numbers in the following ranges will correspond to particular types of courses:
 - a. 100 – 109 — Used at department’s discretion for 100-level courses not counting toward the Foreign Language Requirement (e.g. courses in English)
 - b. 110 – 179 — Reserved for courses designated L1 through L5
 - c. 180 – 199 — Used at department’s discretion for advanced language and other courses; may or may not carry L5 designation.
 - d. 200+ — Used at department’s discretion; may or may not carry L5 designation.
3. Some course descriptions will still require additional designations. For example:
 - a. Prerequisites
 - b. Permission of instructor
 - c. Credit will not be granted for an L1 course until another course designated L2 or higher has been completed at Yale.
 - d. Certain courses are not open to students who have completed certain lower-level courses (e.g. heritage or intensive courses that repeat content from the regular track).
 - e. In a few cases, certain courses numbered 130–149 may be taken for either L3 or L4 credit (e.g. in Egyptian, Latin, Ancient Greek). This will have to be designated in the description in the YCPS.
